MOSQUITO PREVENTION

Dear Residents:

We are writing to you today regarding the mosquito concerns brought to the Whidbey Island Family Housing team. Since we have been made aware of the severity of the mosquitos, we have immediately started working with our Navy Partners to find both short and long term solutions, as we understand the nuisance and concerns mosquitos can cause.

The Maylor Point neighborhood has been assessed; there were areas identified in need of attention to assist in minimizing the mosquitos and we are working with our landscaping contractors to address these, such as areas of standing water in the neighborhoods and overgrown grass in common areas.

As we work with our landscapers to address these areas and identify a long term solution with our Navy Partners, we do ask our residents to assist us with the fenced in backyards by keeping the lawn trimmed and emptying wading pools that are not in use. Additionally, removing standing water from toys, buckets or potted plant trays will help keep the mosquito habitats down.

There are, also, home remedies to help minimize the mosquitos such citronella candles, peppermint and lavender. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work together for a sustainable solution.
